#### JOHN BEMMERLY (1824 – 1872)

Many German families settled in the hilly district along Cache Creek, Oat Valley, Dunnigan Hills, and Hungry Hollow in the 1850's, raising grain and livestock.

John Bemmerly, born in Württemberg, Germany, came to the United States in 1847 and worked in New York as a farm hand until he came overland to California in 1852. Several months of mining brought little success; he then squatted on the land in northwestern Yolo County that he later bought from the United States government. In 1860 he married Agnes Wimmer from Baden, Germany and had five children. He farmed and raised cattle on another ranch near Dunnigan. His premature death left his young wife to supervise the ranch on her own for many years. Agnes Bemmerly expanded the family's holdings to 7,200 acres and operated one of the largest ranches in the county.
